Law with Criminal Justice LLB is unique in that it brings substantive (statutory/written law) and procedural (the 'machinery' to enforce) criminal law together into one programme.

Law with International Arbitration and Commercial Law LLB

Our Law with International Arbitration and Commercial Law LLB degree offers a unique preparation for the realities of modern commercial law by helping you develop expertise both in the substance of contemporary commercial law and in the most important method for the resolution of contemporary business disputes.

Developed in collaboration with an advisory board of internationally-recognised specialists, the degree prepares you for one of the few genuinely cross-border fields of legal practice while ensuring that you still receive the broad legal education offered on a standard LLB course.

The Chartered Institute of Arbitrators has granted Brunel Law School Recognised Course Provider status. This means that when you graduate you will be eligible to become a member of the Institute. Unlike other graduates you will not be required to complete any additional courses to qualify, saving up to £3,000 in extra course fees. The Chartered Institute of Arbitrators is the primary professional body within arbitration, and the Law School is proud that graduates can put MCI Arb after their names (subject to successfully completing Year 1 of the curriculum and the Year 3 module 'International Sales Law and Arbitration').

How we teach

We’re proud of the innovative ways we teach and support our students.

As well as lectures, seminars and one-to-one meetings, you’ll learn and have the opportunity to hone your skills in the moot club and debating society. We also encourage you to learn about law through film and literature and through the variety of CV-building activities that we offer. Law cannot sit in an ivory tower - we encourage you to get involved and bring the subject to life in every possible way.

Throughout the programme, you will confront contemporary, real-world legal challenges - particularly in the criminal justice system - to develop your skills in analysis and critical thinking.

We are one of the few UK law schools with a dedicated skills tutor offering one-on-one support in essay writing, critical thinking, analysis and examination, presentations and time management. International students can take advantage of free in-session English language classes too.

We are aware that for many students, entering university life can be an exciting but challenging experience. All students are allocated a personal tutor from our academic staff who will meet with you regularly and be there to guide and support you in both academic and personal issues.

Getting ready for work

A degree in Law from Brunel Law School is highly regarded internationally. We are well aware how competitive it is, and do everything we can to give you extra experience and skills.

In addition to the placement year for sandwich students, we offer short courses in client interviewing, fraud examination and advocacy. We give you the opportunity to carry out pro bono work - developing your skills in legal research and client interaction - all of which is appealing to prospective employers in the legal profession. CV building is also an integral component of Year 1 and Year 2.

The excellent written and oral communication skills, confidence, discipline, critical thinking, networking, social skills and creativity you develop on the course are valued by employers across the board, whether or not you choose to pursue a career in Law.

Accommodation

As a first year undergraduate you're guaranteed a room on campus. We accommodate over 4500 students in five different complexes which creates a fantastic live/study atmosphere.

Flats come in different sizes accommodating from 4 to 16, and 30 of our 33 halls have en-suite facilities. The Isambard complex incorporates studio flats for co-habiting couples. Adapted and disabled rooms are available in the Isambard Complex, Mill Hall and Fleming Hall.

All rooms are fully furnished with bed and bedding, a desk, chest of drawers, wardrobe and free wifi. Accommodation costs vary between £104.00 to £132.50 a week (based on 2014-15 costs).
